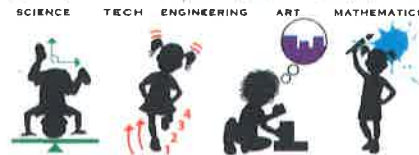
...A note to our families.

In light of COVID-19, we are reposting this little handwashing ditty.

HANDWASHING: Your Best Defense

Handwashing is like a "do-it-yourself" vaccine! It involves 5 simple effective steps - Wet, Lather, Scrub, Rinse, Dry. Regular washing, particularly before and after certain activities is one of the best ways to remove germs, avoid illnesses, and prevent the spread of germs to others. Washing should take place when you are working with food, treating wounds, caring for someone who is sick, working with animals, after toileting, after blowing your nose, after handling garbage, and any other time that your hands feel just plain yucky. It is not necessary to use antibacterial soaps but keep in mind that soap is an important part as it gives the germs something to hold on to as they are scrubbed off your hands and carried away with the water.

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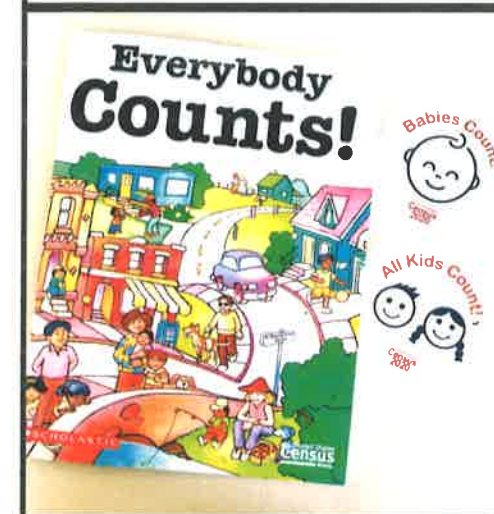
